

An ordinance designating and defining who are disorderly persons, and prescribing a penalty therefore.

Be it ordained, by the chairman and board of trustees of the Village of Clarksfork.

Section 1. All drunkards and tipplers; all persons who shall be drunk or in a state of intoxication in any public street or other public place; all persons who shall be drunk or in a state of intoxication in any private place to the annoyance or disturbance of any citizens or others; all persons who shall disturb the peace, quiet or good order of the neighborhood in which he resides or may be; all persons who shall make, aid or assist in making any disturbance, loud outcry, or improper diversion in any public place or street or other place in said village; all vagrants; all persons who shall ring or cause to be rung the fire bell or fire alarm system of the Village of Clarksfork without sufficient cause therefore; all persons who shall shoot off fire arms, fire crackers, rockets, or shall ignite any dangerous combustible material, or by any other means whatever shall disturb the peace; all persons excepting United States officials, officials of the state of Idaho, county officials, peace officials, guards of any jail, and officers and employees of any express company on duty, who shall carry, knife, sword, sword-cane pistol, revolver, gun or other deadly weapon; all persons who, not in necessary self defense, in the presence of two or more persons, draws or exhibits any fire arms, or other deadly weapon; in a rude, angry and threatening manner; all persons residing in a house of ill fame, or visiting such houses for the purpose of prostitution; all common prostitutes; all persons who shall designedly make any open or indecent or obscene exposure of his or her person, or of the person of another; all persons who shall act in any indecent, vulgar, or immoral manner; all persons who shall deal, play or carry on, open or cause to be opened, or who conducts, either as owner, employee or lessee, whether for hire or not, any game of faro,

monte, roulette or any game played with cards, dice, or any other devise for money, checks, credit or any other representative of value; any person who shall inhumanly, unnecessarily, or cruelly beat or otherwise abuse any dumb animal shall be deemed disorderly persons and punished as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. All persons convicted of being disorderly persons shall be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar and not more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution.

Section 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, in so far as they conflict with this ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication in one issue of the Sandpoint News-Bulletin as required by Law.
