

Card tables

1 ORDINANCE NO. 114  
2 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND REGULATION OF CARD  
3 TABLES, FIXING THE AMOUNT OF THE LICENSE AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTY  
4 FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING EXCEPTIONS AND REPEALING  
5 ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION  
6 OF THIS ORDINANCE.

7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE  
8 VILLAGE OF CLARK FORK, IDAHO:

9 Section 1. No person, club, society, association, firm or  
10 corporation shall operate any public card table without first  
11 having obtained from the Village Clerk a card table license as  
12 herein provided.

13 Section 2. The license herein required shall be issued and  
14 signed by the Village Clerk after payment to the Clerk of the  
15 license fee prescribed by this ordinance and no license shall be  
16 issued for a period longer than three months.

17 Section 3. The license fee to be paid to the Village Clerk  
18 shall be One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each card table for  
19 the period of three months.

20 Section 4. Any person, club, society, association, firm or  
21 corporation violating this ordinance or any provision thereof upon  
22 conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than One (\$1.00)  
23 Dollar or more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each offense.

24 Section 5. Provided, however, that the card parties sponsored  
25 by fraternal, benevolent or social organizations shall be excepted  
26 from the provisions of this ordinance.

27 Section 6. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict  
28 herewith are hereby repealed in so far as they conflict with this  
29 ordinance.

30 Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force  
31 from and after its passage, approval and publication in one issue  
32

1 of the Sandpoint News-Bulletin, a newspaper of general circulation  
2 in the Village of Clark Fork, which is hereby designated as the  
3 official newspaper of the Village for the publication of this  
4 Ordinance.

5 Passed under suspension of the statutes and rules and duly  
6 enacted as an Ordinance of the Village of Clark Fork at an <sup>adjourned</sup> regular  
7 meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Clark Fork  
8 held on the 22nd day of March, 1951.
