AN ORDINANCE ROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF DEVICES INTERFERING WITH RADIO RECEPTION; PROVIDING FOR THE PROCEDURE IN ORDERING THE DISCONTINUANCE OF NON-CONFORMING DEVICES; ROHIBITING THE USE OF LOUDSPEAKERS WITHOUT A PERMIT; LIMITING THE LIMITS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CLARK FORK, IDAHO:

Section 1. Operation of Devices Interfering with Radio Reception Prohibited: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership, association, or corporation knowingly or wantonly to operate or cause to be operated, any machine, device, apparatus, or instrument of any kind whatsoever within the corporate limits of the village of Clark Fork, Idaho, between the hours of eight o'clock a.m. and twelve o'clock midnight, the operation of which shall cause reasonably preventable electrical interference with radio reception, within said municipal limits; provided, however, that x-ray pictures, examinations, or treatments may be made at any time if the machines or apparatus used therefor are properly equipped to avoid all unnecessary or reasonably preventable interference with radio reception and are not negligently operated.

Section 2. Procedure in Ordering Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Devices:
When an inspection and test shall have been made by the Fire Marshal of the
Village of Clark Fork, Idaho, or other person appointed by the Board of Trustees,
and it is found that equipment or apparatus coming within the terms of this
crdimence is being operated in violation of this ordinance the person or persons
responsible for the operation of such equipment shall be notified in writing
to discontinue the use of such machine or to make additions, repairs or
modifications thereof in order that the same may be operated in a manner which
complies with the provisions of this ordinance. The mailing of a registered
letter addressed to the owner or operator of the machine at the premises where
the machine is located shall constitute a sufficient notice for the purpose
of this ordinance. In the event that the owner or operator of such machine
or apparatus does not, within forty-eight hours after receipt of notice to
repair or discontinue the use of such machine, either entirely discontinue

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the use of such machine during the hours the use of such machine is prohibited by such ordinance, or repair of the same so that it complies with the provisions of this ordinance, such owner shall be deemed to be operating such machine or apparatus in violation of the provisions of this ordinance and such persons shall be subject to the penalties hereafter provided for such violation. Section 3. Loud Speakers to Obtain Permit for Use: It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a loud speaker in such manner that the noise therefrom shall be directed upon any street or public place in the Village of Clark Fork, Idaho. without first having obtained a permit from the Village Clerk. That such permit designates a location of said loud speaker and the hours for the operation of the same and that said permit may be revoked at any time. Section 4. Scope of Act: That this act shall not be held or construed to embrace or cover the regulation of any transmitting, broadcasting or receiving instrument, apparatus, or devise used or useful in interstate commerce or the operation of which instrument, apparatus, or device is licensed or authorized by or under the provisions of any act of the Congress of the United States. Section 5. Penalty For Violations: That every person, copartnership, association, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished for not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or by imprisonment in the village jail for not more than thirty (30) days or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each day during which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication in one issue of the Sandpoint News-Bulletin a newspaper of general circulation in the Village of Clark Fork, which is hereby designated as the official newspaper of the Village for the publication of this Ordinance.

Passed and approved under suspension of the rules and statutes upon which a roll call vote was duly taken and duly enacted as an Ordinance of the Village of Clark Fork at a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees held May 3, 1954.
