ORDINANCE NO. 155

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING TO BE A NUISANCE THE ENTRY OF SOLICITORS, PEDDLERS, HAWKERS, ITINERANT MERCHANTS OR TRANSIENT VENDORS UPON PRIVATE RESIDENCES TO SOLICIT ORDERS OR SELL GOODS WITHOUT REQUEST OR INVITATION FROM THE OWNER OR OCCUPANT; DECLARING A VIOLATION TO BE A MISDEMEANOR AND PUNISHABLE BY A FINE AND THE LIMITS THEREOF; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF SUCH ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARK FORK, IDAHO:

Section 1. UNINVITED PEDDLERS DECLARED A NUISANCE:

The practice of going in and upon private residences in the municipality
by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants or transient vendors
or merchandise not having been requested or invited to do so by the owner
or occupant of said private residence, for the purpose of soliciting orders
for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise and/or disposing of and/or
peddling or hawking the same, is declared to be a nuisance and punishable
as provided herein.

Section 2. EXCEPTIONS: The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to the sale or soliciting orders for the sale of milk, dairy products, vegetables, poultry, eggs and other farm and garden produce so far as the sale of such commodities herein named is now authorized by law.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this

Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall
be fined no less than \$ 25 nor more than \$300.00.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication in one issue of the Sandpoint News Bulletin, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Clark Fork, which is hereby designated as the official newspaper of this City for publication of this Ordinance.

Passed under suspension of the rules, and duly enacted as an Ordinance of the City of Clark Fork, Idaho, at a regular meeting of the City Council of said City held on the day of September, 1970.
