ORDINANCE NO. 231

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CLARK FORK, IDAHO, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, ESTABLISHING A FIRE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR APPOINTMENT AND ESTABLISHMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE FIRE CHIEF; PROVIDING RIGHT TO ENTER; ADOPTING THE 2000 INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE; ESTABLISHING VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS OR SIX MONTHS INCARCERATION OR BOTH FOR MISDEMEANORS AND FIFTY DOLLARS FOR INFRACTIONS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING REPEAL OF ORDINANCE 137 AND ALL OTHER CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARK FORK, IDAHO AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.0 ESTABLISHMENT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

A Fire Department of the City is hereby established.

SECTION 2.0 APPOINTMENT AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE FIRE CHIEF

- A. A fire chief shall be appointed as an officer of the city by the mayor with the consent of the city council. The fire chief shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor, subject to the removal provisions set forth in Idaho Code section 50-206 or its successor. The fire chief shall be the head of the Fire Department and shall have supervision over all of the employees and volunteers thereof.
- B. The fire chief shall administer all programs and joint exercise of power agreements with other jurisdictions providing fire and life protection services and is authorized to enforce all ordinances related to fire prevention, fire suppression, and the elimination of fire hazards and the administration of life safety codes related thereto by inspecting, or causing to be inspected by his designee, buildings, premises and public thoroughfares within the Clark Fork city limits for the purpose of enforcing the Uniform Fire Code, the appropriate sections of this ordinance and any other legal requirements relating to fire prevention or suppression.
- C. The fire chief has the authority, in the event of an emergency, to blockade any street, alley, sidewalk or other place if necessary to ensure proper operation and protection of Fire Department equipment from damage and to take such steps as may be reasonably necessary to suppress a fire or provide relief from other emergency occurrences.

SECTION 3.0 RIGHT OF ENTRY

The fire chief is hereby empowered to enter any and all structures and premises at any reasonable hour for the purposes of conducting a fire plan, inspections and to serve written notice upon the owner and occupant to abate, within a specified time, any and all fire hazards that may be found.

A. Any person(s) so served with a notice to abate any fire hazards shall comply therewith and promptly notify the fire chief as set forth by the Uniform Fire Code.

SECTION 4.0 ADOPTION OF THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE

The 2000 International Fire Code is hereby adopted.

SECTION 5.0 VIOLATIONS

- A. It shall be unlawful to impede, willfully disturb or otherwise interfere with any member of the Fire Department when answering or attending an emergency.
- B. Except for fire personnel, it shall be unlawful to park within four hundred feet (400'), or other distance communicated by the fire chief or his designee, of any emergency vehicle attending an emergency.
- C. It shall be unlawful to drive a motor vehicle over a fire hose, except upon specific orders from the fire chief or other officer when the hose is in use.
- D. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle or cause any obstruction to be placed within twenty feet (20') of the entrance of any fire station or other place where fire equipment/apparatus is stored or within twenty feet (20') of any fire hydrant or cistern or as otherwise stated in the Idaho Code.
- E. It shall be unlawful to follow within four hundred feet (400') any apparatus belonging to the Fire Department and in active service or to park any vehicle within four hundred feet (400') of a fire.
- F. It shall be unlawful to knowingly or maliciously turn in or cause to be turned in a false alarm.
- G. It shall be unlawful for any person to cross a fire blockade without the permission of the fire chief or other Fire Department personnel.
- H. It shall be unlawful for a person to enter any place where fire apparatus is housed or handle any apparatus or equipment belonging to the Fire Department unless accompanied by, or having express permission of, an officer or authorized member of the department.

SECTION 6.0 PENALTIES

- A. Violation of Section 5.0 A, C, F, G and H shall be misdemeanors punishable by a fine not to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300.00), or incarceration not to exceed six (6) months, or by both fine and incarceration.
- B. Violation of Section 5.0 B, D and E shall be infractions punishable by a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00).

SECTION 7.0 SEVERABILITY

This ordinance is hereby declared to be severable. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect and shall be read to carry out the purpose(s) of the ordinance before the declaration of partial invalidity.

SECTION 8.0 REPEAL OF CONFLICTING PROVISIONS

All provisions of Ordinance 137 and any other ordinances of the City of Clark Fork which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 9.0 EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication as provided by law.
