## CITY OF CLARK FORK, IDAHO

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, certain areas of Clark Fork are subject to periodic flooding from streams, rivers and lakes, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of Federally subsized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Council, to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to Idaho Code - Title 67 - Chapter 65;

Now, therefore be it RESOLVED, that this Council hereby:

l. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force for those areas having flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

2. Vests the City Clerk with the responsibility, Authority, and

means to:

(a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.

(b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request

concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain.

(c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

(d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and

implementation of flood plain management measures.

3. Appoints the City Clerk to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request a record of elevations of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest flood is below grade on one or more sides, the elevation of the flood immediately above must also be recorded.

4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reason-

ably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.
